A guide to meeting pesticide label requirements

Accounting for all application variables through careful recordkeeping is a significant step in pesticide stewardship. As an applicator, it is important to keep a detailed record of each application on file, whether or not the product requires you to do so. Comprehensive recordkeeping helps applicators follow the proper procedures and precautions to take at the time of the application, and also serves as official documentation that can be referenced at any time. Use this resource to help you keep accurate, up-to-date records, and be sure to read the product label before every application to comply with the outlined applicator requirements.
